Prayer Items:**A Special Celebration**

This Lord's Day we eagerly anticipate the celebration of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper during the morning worship service.

We are not casual about this observance. Rather, we look upon this remembrance of our Lord's death as a holy and precious experience! The Scripture promises rich blessing to those who approach it rightly (1 Cor. 10:16-17), and warns of spiritual harm to those who don't (1 Cor. 11:27-30).

Because of this instruction in God's Word, and for the good of everyone concerned, our church asks that all who wish to participate in the receiving of the Bread and the Cup, first meet with our Elders (the Session) to make a profession of their personal faith in Jesus Christ, describe their relationship to a true branch of Christ's Church, and discuss the meaning of this Sacrament.

This informal interview can be arranged to the convenience of each person interested, but due to time constraints may not be possible in relation to this morning's observance.

In any case, we hope today can be a great blessing for you, as you hear God's Word preached, join in His praises, and witness this simple, yet profound Memorial Celebration which recalls the sacrificial death of our Lord Jesus Christ for His people.

May you experience God's grace and love abundantly!
